Report on Inclusivity Resolution

September 5, 2023

9/14/2021 Resolution

- 1) Human Services shall develop and/or identify and maintain resources and/or programs that provide support for the LGBTQ+ community of adults and children in Manchester.
- 2) Public Works shall conduct a study of existing Town Buildings, including all school buildings, to determine the cost and feasibility of establishing gender-neutral lavatory facilities.
- 3) Work with Human Resources to
 - a) Ensure all customer-facing departments and employees receive training to increase LGBTQ+ cultural competency
 - b) Identify a designated liaison that shall serve as a point-of-contact for members of Manchester's LGBTQ+ community
 - c) Ensures a culturally relevant customer service approach is taken in all interactions with residents and visitors who may be susceptive to discrimination or unequal treatment



Human Services

- Town Budget provides annual support to the Hartford Lesbian and Gay Health Collective (HLGHC)
 - \$13,433 serving people living with HIV/AIDS, providing medical case management, health education, food bank and meals, medication adherence support, HIV testing, social activities, Information and referral, AID-A-Pet and holiday food baskets
- The Senior Center agreement with CT Healthy Living Collective to be a LGBTQ+ Moveable Senior Center site, which includes a commitment to inclusivity, additional staff training, and LGBTQ+ programming (2 upcoming events this year)
- Senior Center staff received training certificates in Transgender Aging, Supporting LGBTQ+ Older Adults, and Preventing Bullying from SAGE - Advocacy & Services for LGBTQ+ Elders











Facility Study

- Internal assessment of all town facilities
 - Identified locations/types of lavatory facilities
 - Researched industry standards/trends
 - Conversations with individuals representing the community
- Meeting held with BoE staff
- Public Works has identified 34 single occupancy restrooms throughout the Town

- Triangle Community Center, Inc.
- LGBTQ+ 101: An Introduction to Identities & Allyship
 - Foundational training, intending to engage participants in a thorough overview of the LGBTQ+ community, and space for learning, reflection, and team-building for allies and LGBTQ+ folks alike. From terminology and definitions to rethinking historical and traditional assumptions about gender and sexuality, this training is a must for all those who wish to build ever-more inclusive and affirming practices.
