General Manager's Report

Holiday Closings

Town offices will be closed on December 24, 25, and January 1 in observance of the Christmas and New Year holidays. Trash will not be collected on December 25 or January 1 and will be delayed one day for the remainder of each holiday week. The Landfill and Transfer Station will be closed on December 25 and January 1. Mary Cheney and Whiton Libraries will be closed on Monday, December 24, Tuesday, December 25, and Tuesday, January 1. Library hours for Monday, December 31 are 9am-5pm.

Assessment and Collection

Work on the Motor Vehicle Supplemental Grand List as of October 1, 2017 continues. This is the process used to assess and tax vehicles registered after the October 1, 2017 assessment date, but registered by July 31, 2018. The Connecticut DMV provides a file to each municipality for vehicles to be placed on their Supplemental Grand Lists. This year's file was sent the first week of March, over three weeks earlier than last year. The number of vehicles on this year's Supplemental Grand List, both in Manchester and Statewide, is larger than last year, though last year's list had a number of vehicles that were initially left off the list and had to be added later by DMV. Supplemental Motor Vehicle Tax Bills will be mailed in late December.

We are anticipating the arrival of the data for our Motor Vehicle Regular Grand List of October 1, 2018 in early December. We are optimistic that data list file will arrive close to the December 1st statutory deadline, and the DMV believes it should be early in December, earlier than it has been the past several years.

Work on the Personal Property Grand List of October 1, 2018 continues as well.

Tax payments for all real estate, certain personal property accounts (over \$400) and Motor Vehicle supplemental tax bills are due in January. If payments are not made by Friday,

February 1, 2019, interest will be due from January 1, 2019 at 18% per annum with a \$2.00 minimum interest charge. It should be noted that there is no mailing for the second Real Estate and Personal Property bill installment. Real Estate and Personal Property tax bills were mailed on June 21, 2018 and contained both the first and second installment coupons. Any taxpayer who is unsure whether or not a tax payment is owed, or how much is owed, before February 1, 2019, should call the Tax Collector's Office at 860-647-3018, or check online on the Town's "Online Bill Pay and Tax Payment Look Up" page. Tax bills may be paid at Town Hall, weekdays between 8:30 AM and 5:00 PM, and there is night drop box behind Town Hall for after-hour payments. Payments may also be made through mail. Payments by E-check or credit card may also be made online (a convenience fee applies). We recommend that taxpayers wishing to pay online make their payments at least five days before the February 1st deadline as over the last few days of the payment cycle, user demand may exceed the available amount of customers that our off-site website can accommodate. Paying a few days earlier, will alleviate this problem.

Account Associate Laira Rehbein recently took and passed CCMC Course 1, the first of four courses needed to become a Certified Connecticut Municipal Collector (CCMC) Course II. Director of Assessment & Collection John Rainaldi received the CAAO (Connecticut Association of Assessing Officers) "Presidential Award" in November by CAAO President Chandler Rose (of Windham). The Presidential Award is given annually by the CAAO President to a CAAO member, based on that member's contributions to the organization during the president's administration.

Holiday Safety

Please enjoy your holiday season safely! Many fires, burns and other fire-related injuries occur at this time of year. The National Fire Protection Association reports a high incidence of home candle fires each year in the month of December. Increased use of candles and fireplaces, combined with an increase in the amount of combustible, seasonal decorations present in many homes means more risk for fire.

- Never leave burning candles unattended or sleep in a room with a lit candle
- Keep candles out of reach of children
- Make sure candles are on stable surfaces
- Don't burn candles near trees, curtains or any other flammable items
- Don't burn trees, wreaths or wrapping paper in the fireplace
- Check and clean the chimney and fireplace area at least once a year (Keep Santa safe!)
