Who were the people who were already settled on the land when Europeans first arrived in Southern New England, and where had they come from? How did they live before the Mayflower dropped anchor in Cape Cod Bay, and what changed as the European population increased? Manchester attorney Steve Penny will take us from our roots in Africa to our local tribe, the Podunks, spanning 60,000 years of human activity.



- 1. **The March 17** presentation focuses on pre-European contact and the Pequot War.
- 2. **The April 14** presentation focuses on the 40 years between the Pequot War and King Philip's War, when the Narragansetts and Mohegans battled over control of the former Pequot land.
- 3. **The May 19** presentation is about King Philip's War and its devastating consequences for the tribes of Southern New England, including our local tribe, the Podunks.
